East 4th graders tackle the PARCC practice test!

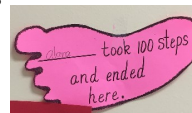

Third graders in Mrs. Trimble's class had the opportunity to use the school's new laptops in the classroom. They were able to experience

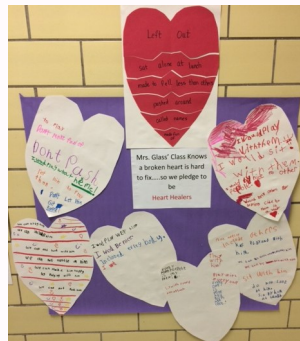


answering PARCC like questions based on skills we had worked on recently. They love that they can all be on the internet at the same time without going to the computer lab.



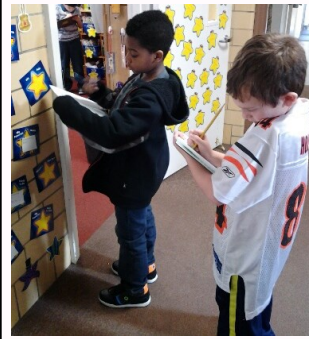
Mrs. Glass' class celebrated the 100th day of school on Feb. 2nd.

Mrs. Glass' students also enjoyed the hygienists from Dr. Diers office talking to them about dental health.

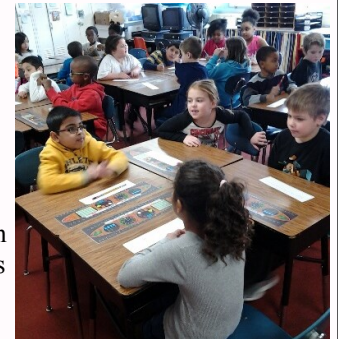
