

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN FAIRFIELD CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT AND BUTLER COUNTY EDUCATIONAL SERVICE CENTER, FOR COLLABORATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES FOR PRESCHOOL SERVICES

The Butler County Educational Service Center (BCESC) and the Fairfield City School District (FCSD) within Butler County will jointly provide services to students who are eligible under the Rules for the Education of Preschool and/or Children with Handicaps (Rule 3301-31 of the Administrative Code) under the following conditions:

### Child Find Services:

Fairfield City Schools will provide services for Child Find according to IDEA regulations.

## Preschool Services:

- Fairfield City Schools and Butler County ESC agree to collaborate in the operation and delivery of preschool services to children in Fairfield City Schools.
- 2. The BCESC will employ a Supervisor to improve services to children and their families. FCSD should meet with parents to discuss options for their child. If ECE (Early Childhood Education)/Special Education Preschool is the appropriate option, the family and child will be referred to the appropriate ESC staff for enrollment. The BCESC will oversee enrollment, IEP implementation, professional development, supervision/evaluation of BCESC staff, and oversee the communication among partnering agencies.
- 3. Out of District Placement: Unless otherwise arranged, if the FCSD seeks to place children within other programs/districts, FCSD must work with that district in making those arrangements.
- 4. The BCESC will be responsible for EMIS guidance, coordination of the implementation of IEP, employment of Supervisor, employment of one (1) Special Education preschool classroom teacher and employment of one (1) preschool teacher.
- 5. BCESC will provide related supervision, licensing compliance, mandated training for staff in child abuse, first aid, and common childhood illnesses. The BCESC will collaborate with FCSD to provide training for staff, supervision, monitoring, and evaluation. Both parties agree to have mutual interest in the direction and betterment of programming related to guidance, goal setting, commendations and/or direction of the staff members involved in the partnership.
- 6. FCSD will provide or contract separately for provision of the related services including occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech services, Itinerant IEP services, specialized IEP mandated nursing services, and other IEP mandated staffing to eligible children served in the preschool classroom.

- 7. FCSD will provide transportation for IEP preschool students if mandated by the individual child's IEP, classroom space and custodial services, and representation and sign off at IEP meetings, as needed. FCSD also agrees to support administrative needs, including access to and use of a copy machine, fax and internet, in instances where the rest of the school building is so connected.
- 8. Fairfield City School District agrees to reimburse the BCESC \$108,000, billed quarterly.

This agreement will be in effect for one school year commencing July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012

Both parties agree to resolve disputes over obligations set forth in this agreement as reasonably as possible. However, this agreement or parts of this agreement can be terminated by either party for cause provided that either party provide written notice to the other party of the defaults that are claimed to have occurred and give the party ten (10) days within which to cure such defaults. In the event that the defaults are not cured, notice in writing will be given to the defaulting party and this agreement will terminate within ninety (90) days of such notice.

Administrative coordination for this agreement will be the responsibility of designated individuals of FCSD and the BCESC. These individuals will be responsible for the implementation and monitoring of this contract and will meet regularly to review the progress of the agreement.


