- 3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel and administration
- 4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation
- 5. Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules
- 6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Effective September 15, 2011, the Board directs that the Fairfield City School District 401(a) Plan be terminated effective September 15, 2011 and amounts under such Plan be distributed to Plan participants and, as applicable; beneficiaries as soon as administratively feasible in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code and regulations thereunder.
